

# <u>The Hong Kong Jockey Club Presents – Painting Her Way: The Ink Art of Fang Zhaoling</u> <u>Opening Ceremony Photo Release</u>



(Hong Kong, September 26, 2017) Asia Society Hong Kong Center today unveils its new exhibition **The Hong Kong Jockey Club Presents – Painting Her Way: The Ink Art of Fang Zhaoling** (the "Exhibition") at its Chantal Miller Gallery. Exclusively presented by The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust, the Exhibition will feature a selection of paintings and calligraphy by the distinguished female artist Fang Zhaoling (1914-2006). Officially opening on September 27, it will run until December 31, 2017.

Funded by a \$2.86 million donation from The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust, the Exhibition, its accompanying education programs, entitled "The Jockey Club Art Education and Female Empowerment Series", and its docent tours will be free for the public to enjoy.

The opening ceremony for the exhibition was held today at The Hong Kong Jockey Club Hall, Asia Society Hong Kong Center. Officiating guests included The Hon. Mrs. Carrie Lam Cheng Yuet-ngor, GBM, GBS, Chief Executive of the HKSAR; Dr. Simon S O Ip, GBS CBE JP, Chairmanof The Hong Kong Jockey Club; Mr. Ronnie Chan, Co-Chair of Asia Society and Chairman of Asia Society Hong Kong Center; Ms. S. Alice Mong, Executive Director, Asia Society Hong Kong Center; Dr. David Fang, Chairman, Fang Zhaoling Foundation and guest curators Ms. Julia Andrews and Mr. Kuiyi Shen.

Speaking at the opening ceremony of the Exhibition, S. Alice Mong, Executive Director of Asia Society Hong Kong Center said, "We are very proud to present this major solo exhibition of Fang Zhaoling's distinguished works. Despite the tremendous talents of female artists in the 20<sup>th</sup> century, they rarely receive due attention for their creative attainments and influences compared to their male counterparts. At Asia Society Hong Kong Center, we want to lead the way to shed light on the lessernoticed achievements of this exemplary artistic segment. By providing local Hong Kong audiences with important examples of their artistic accomplishments, we hope to honor them with the public recognition they deserve for their contribution to the making of modern China."

Chairman of The Hong Kong Jockey Club Dr Simon S O Ip noted that Arts, Culture and Heritage was one of four strategic focus areas of the Club's Charities Trust donations. In addition to supporting arts venues and events, and nurturing talent through scholarships, the Club wanted to help broaden the base for the arts, promote a diversity of art forms and create more opportunities for people to participate in the arts at every level of the community and in every part of Hong Kong.

"Our support for this exhibition exemplifies this approach – sharing the work of Fang Zhaoling in an exhibition which is free and open to all," he observed. "In addition, we will be providing transport subsidies for underprivileged families, while The Jockey Club Art Education and Female Empowerment Series, running alongside the exhibition, includes free public lectures, dialogue sessions, movie screenings and more."
