Appointment of Joyce Ng as Head of Gallery and Exhibitions

Hong Kong, January 14, 2022 – Asia Society Hong Kong Center (ASHK) has appointed Joyce Ng as Head of Gallery and Exhibitions who will take up her position on January 24.

Joyce comes with more than 10 years of experience in the art world. She has previously worked at Art Central as Head of VIP Relations in Hong Kong, Taipei and Singapore for more than three years, responsible for managing private and corporate art collectors, initiating new partnerships, liaising with government officials involved in cultural policymaking, and producing an annual cycle of collector communications.

Prior to Art Central, Joyce worked at Christie's in their Hong Kong, Shanghai, London and Paris offices. As Client Strategy Account Manager, she delivered top client events with a £1million operating budget to support strategic agendas involving Christie's CEO's Office, President's Office and UK Chairman's Office, and developed bespoke art, travel and educational programs for a wide clientele. Prior to that, she served as Business Intelligence Manager, identifying business opportunities in Asian art, and formulating client and artwork-specific strategies.

At the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, Joyce devised monthly educational programs for university students, part of the museum's Multicultural Audience Development Initiative. She serves as a Hong Kong University Museum Society Executive Committee Member, and Friends of the Hong Kong Museum of Art Executive Committee Member. She holds a Bachelor's Degree in English and Art History from Barnard College, Columbia University, and a Master's Degree in International Law from SOAS.

Alice Mong said: "We look forward to welcoming on board Joyce Ng to head our Gallery and Exhibitions team, as we celebrate 10 years of our Former Explosives Magazine heritage site. With her experience in art, relationship management and business development, I believe that she can take our Gallery and Exhibitions team to the next level, and bring more groundbreaking exhibitions to our Center."
